Survey

INDIANAPOLIS, March 11, 2009— The Indiana Finance Authority (IFA)'s State Revolving Fund (SRF) Loan Program requests the cooperation of the residents of Country Squire Lakes in Jennings County, Indiana to complete a survey, that is required by the State for the Jennings Northwest Regional Utilities to be eligible for grant funding to complete needed upgrades and repairs to the Utility's Wastewater Treatment Plant and its collection system located throughout Country Squire Lakes (CSL).

Starting next week, a confidential door-to-door survey will be conducted by volunteers representing CSL Homeowners and the Utility, under the direction of Ivy Tech Southeast and the Southeastern Indiana Regional Planning Commission. The purpose of the survey will be to obtain income information from the residents of CSL in order to determine the number of low to moderate-income households within the service area.

The IFA's State Revolving Fund (SRF) Loan Programs provide low-interest loans to Indiana communities for projects that improve wastewater and drinking water infrastructure. The Program's mission is to provide low-cost financial assistance in order to construct necessary and environmentally sound drinking water and wastewater infrastructure; to facilitate statewide compliance with state and federal drinking water and wastewater quality standards; to maintain a fiscally self-sufficient program as a continuing source of funding for improvement and protection of public health and water quality; and to conduct any other activity permitted by the Safe Drinking Water Act or the Clean Water Act.
